A Message From the Head of School: **Ora Shulman**

Back in 2008, in my first Open House presentation for prospective families at AHS, one of my slides showed that when three-year-olds come to our school for Nursery, we think about what skills they will need when they become young adults in 2023.

A lot has happened in the past fifteen years - a lot has happened in the past five years! - but much of what was reflected in that slideshow holds true today. As I expressed then, we are raising kids together, teachers and parents in partnership. Building meaningful relationships continues to be at the heart of our educational endeavour.

As this is my last year as Head of School, I have enjoyed many "last first times" over the past year, and have had many opportunities to reflect on and appreciate the connections I have made at AHS, on both a personal and communal level. The world we live in continues to change, and we don't know where some of these changes will take us, but we know, just as our predictions in 2008 have served us in good stead through to 2023, that the meaningful learning experiences and personal relationships and connections that we provide our students will stay with them, and will continue to be valuable to them, in the years to come. We are reminded that at the core of education is preparing for the next generation.

Education is a process which is informed by relationships with people, time, and context. One aspect of that context, at Associated, is our relationship with Israel - and in this issue, as we celebrate the 75th anniversary of Israel's statehood, we have captured many examples of that relationship.

Our roots, where we come from, inform who we are and the connections that we make.

I was born in Israel, and moved to Toronto when I was raising my own children. Israel has always been an intrinsic part of my identity, and it has always been one of my goals to convey that same sense of connection to our students. I think AHS does this wonderfully; Israel is present all year round at our school. I invite you to read on, and to join me in marvelling at the connections that continue to hold our community together, reaching between Toronto and Israel.

Meet Our Incoming Head of School: **Dr. Lee-Ron Kaye**

We were thrilled to have the opportunity to sit down with Dr. Lee-Ron Kaye, our incoming Head of School, and ask her some questions to learn more about her and her vision for the future of AHS.



Tell us about your career trajectory and the journey that led you to where you are today.

After completing my initial Teacher Education program, I applied to be a General Studies teacher. As I was interviewing for the position, I had a sudden change of heart. I realized that there was both greater need and greater opportunity in the Judaic Studies division to "Innovate Tradition, and Traditionalize Innovation." I was inspired to integrate my newly acquired pedagogical knowledge with my deeply rooted Judaic knowledge to innovate in Jewish Education. I wanted to instill in students that same love and passion for Jewish learning that I hold so dear. As I taught in the classroom, I concurrently pursued Graduate studies in Education, completing first my Masters in Teaching and Learning, and then, as I found my niche in STEAM education, a doctorate in Educational Leadership. I wrote my thesis on STEAM integration at a faith-based dual curriculum model school, forming an Organizational Improvement Plan that I had the opportunity to execute over time as I moved into successive leadership positions at AHS. As a lifelong learner who perpetually seeks growth, I am approaching this next chapter in my AHS journey with great excitement, inspired by the opportunities ahead.

What is your favourite AHS memory?

As I've been a part of AHS for over 15 years, my heart is filled with so many fond memories. One memory that stands out happened on my first day teaching. After I spent weeks planning my lesson and giving it my all, the day ended with one girl proclaiming, "I don't like Kitah Aleph." While it may seem strange to include this moment among favourite memories, it is my favourite because of its significance in shaping who I am today. This moment taught me how to fail, and that failing is not failure.

Failing is an important part of the journey to success, feedback that helps us to better reach our goal. True failure only occurs when we give up.

It is with this growth mindset that I lead by example and share this lesson with teachers and students. Moreover, this moment also helped shape my educational philosophy. It highlighted the importance of a student-centred approach - it is only by learning what our students are interested

in and what motivates them that we can design effective lessons. It brings me great joy to share that the student mentioned is now completing her undergraduate degree and refers to that year in Kitah Aleph as her favourite year of learning.

How do you measure success?

I am surrounded by success at AHS. Success is smiling students walking into school each morning, students inviting others to play with them at recess, the look on students' faces when they invent new ideas, students proudly leading brachot that they learned in class at their Shabbos table. One measure of success that particularly resonates with me is when alumni return to visit or volunteer. The fact that they want to reconnect with their teachers, share stories, and help out shows that we were successful in imparting a strong sense of belonging to our community. When students volunteer or return as student-teachers, lending their time and talents to mentor their younger peers, it is a true marker that we were successful in fulfilling our mission to produce graduates who are inspired to be leaders and contributors in their Jewish community.



What do you love most about AHS?

I love that we welcome everyone, and I love everyone that we welcome. The students, parents, grandparents, teachers, staff, and lay leaders all feel like members of one big family to me - we are Mishpachat AHS! I love that we are a community school and that the uniqueness of each member is celebrated for the richness it adds to our tapestry. I am proud to be part of a demographic that can best be described as a mosaic. I consider this to be one of our school's greatest strengths. We cultivate a strong sense of community amongst a diverse group of people, and we do this by teaching values of inclusion, empathy, and celebration of individuality.



What is your vision for the future of AHS?

One of the biggest challenges is thinking about what we don't yet know, and considering not only what is plausible, but what is possible. The ability to imagine beyond limits is a trait I inherited from my mother, and it is most valuable in my role as a leader. When thinking about what lies ahead on the educational horizon, it is clear that advancements in Artificial Intelligence will have a strong impact. With platforms capable of producing comprehensive texts with just a few keystrokes, many educators are wary of the challenge this presents for assessment.

I look at this not as a challenge, but as an opportunity. We are presented with the opportunity to teach students about integrity, and to leverage these tools in a transparent and effective manner to serve their needs, goals, and interests.

I am a strong proponent of STEAM education and I believe that it is enhanced to its fullest potential when infused with Judaic content. The rapid development of AI technology presents us with the opportunity to traditionalize this innovation by putting the "AI" in Judaism; we can creatively consider how to leverage these technologies to support the Jewish community and create a bright Jewish future - this is an inquiry I look forward to exploring with the students of AHS.

Aliyah Highlight: The Hershtal Family

The Hershtal family - Emily, Aaron, Ariel, Maytal, Ilan, and Levi - are an Associated family who made Aliyah a year ago. They were kind enough to share some of their experiences with us here.

We are currently residing in the north of Israel in Zichron Yaakov. It's a small town on the top of a mountain. We were welcomed into a beautiful community and have found a very happy and meaningful life here. Making Aliyah was one of the hardest challenges we have ever been faced with. We uprooted our family, moved across the world, and had to start over. The biggest challenge has perhaps also been one of the most positive experiences we have faced. We have put ourselves in a position in which, in order to not just exist but also thrive, we have had to be vulnerable and resilient. That's hard. Asking for help is hard. Accepting so much from others is hard. Learning a new way to live and shoving your ego down is hard. But being open, willing, accepting, feeling, and really living? That's priceless.

Associated continues to play a very important role in our lives. Our children left Associated with strong Hebrew language skills thanks to the incredible Lurit B'lurit program. They were comfortable typing in Hebrew, as well, which was amazing! We maintain a strong connection with the faculty at Associated and lean on them for guidance, advice, love and support. Associated planted seeds in our children that have carried them through some pretty challenging times throughout our Aliyah journey. They became confident, strong children who felt loved and supported every step of the way throughout their Associated days. They learned to believe in themselves and to trust themselves, and learned to find what makes them special, and use it to shine. They learned how to love Judaism and the Torah, and they built a very special connection with Judaism. They learned to embrace those who were different from them and focus on what makes us similar. Thankfully, they took these important lessons and values with them into our new lives.

Associated will forever hold a very special place in our hearts and we miss the staff, the kids, and the families daily.



A Match Made at AHS



Ezra Nadler '13 and Yona Grossman '13 first met in Grade Three at Posluns, when Yona moved to Associated. For the next three years, they were in the same class, and they got to know each other through their class and school community.

The Interfaces Program: An Inspiring Visit to Israel

As part of the 2-year UJA Israel Interfaces program, Innovations in Israel Education, AHS educators Zohara Greenbaum '98 (Danilack) and Omer Lachman (Posluns) joined a delegation from several Toronto Jewish day schools, representing AHS on a 7-day learning mission to Israel.

The Interfaces program strives to impart to North American teachers the tools to give their students a comprehensive understanding of the importance of Israel to diaspora Jews and to foster long-lasting, authentic, and meaningful connections to Israel and to its people. It is founded on seven core pillars: Israel's Geopolitical Context; Israel as the State and Homeland of the Jewish People; Israel as a Jewish and a Democratic State; Israel's Civic Society; The Israeli Mosaic; Israeli Culture and Arts: A Look at Past and Present Trends and Symbolism; and Israel, the Arab Nations and Nationalities.

Participants attended seminars on these seven pillars, and, upon arriving in Israel, were immersed in learning experiences that showcased Israel's complexities. Influential Israeli scholars, educators, and former politicians met with them and spoke on key topics including contemporary Israeli history and current events. They discussed issues such as the tension between religion and state in Israel, Arab-Jewish relations, and the education and Jewish life of communities in Israel's periphery.

One highlight of the visit was meeting with high school students from Sderot. Our staff witnessed the resilience and dedication of those living in a town where sirens and rocket attacks are the norm, and reaffirmed the strong connection between Canadian Jewry and Israel in general and between Toronto's Jewish community and Sderot in particular. Throughout the city, schools and community centres bore messages such as "Beit Canada" and "supported by the UJA Federation of Toronto."

Participants were treated to a culinary tour of the Mahane Yehuda Shuk. They heard personal stories of chesed and perseverance from families who have lived and worked in the Shuk for over a century. The cultural mosaic of Israel shines through in Mahane Yehuda.

The ulpan they visited in an Eilat high school exemplified Israel's role as a protector of the Jewish people. They met with Jewish teenagers from around the globe, including two Jewish refugees who fled the war in Ukraine and had arrived in Israel just 2 days before the visit. They met with Ashaga Araro, director of the Battae Ethiopian Israeli Heritage Centre, who described her family's epic journey from Ethiopia to Israel and discussed the lives of Jewish Ethiopian communities in Israel.

Upon returning to Canada, our staff have begun to share what they learned. They led a PD session for our Judaic Studies staff on Teaching and Learning About Israel with Complexity, and are guiding students in making connections between Jewish History and Israel today. The seven curricular pillars of Interfaces can be found in our lessons, programs, and learning experiences, as our staff continue to attend seminars to further their knowledge.

CURRICULUM ENHANCEMENT

The *Devash* Parsha magazine enriches the Torah learning of our students in Grades 3-5. A sponsorship of \$15,000 will enable us to continue offering *Devash* for three years.

Collaborative Professional Learning



Junior-Intermediate members formed another sub-group to align the Writing program across the grades with a unifying framework to better scaffold students' acquisition of skills and provide teachers with meaningful resources to guide instruction.

Our Lurit inquiry involves examining our shared vision for language acquisition, and discussing strategies and best practices to enhance communicative competency for students across all grades.

Members of the Mathematics collaborative team commented on the value of this inquiry process:

“The team gave us an opportunity to share with one another all of the great things that we were already doing in our Math programs, while at the same time identifying next steps and gathering data to align our practices to even further support student learning.”

Research has found that the most effective professional learning is school-based and content-specific, grounded in the instructional materials and strategies that teachers use with their students. In order to continue to implement high-quality instructional materials and align our practices, AHS has engaged in collaborative professional inquiry with the creation of four Professional Collaborative Learning teams: Math, Literacy, Wellness, and Hebrew.

Our goal is for these four collaborative teams to become an outcomes-based group of educators engaging in deep team learning, where evidence-based conversations can consistently occur. Based on the information these teams generate, decisions can be made in planning instruction moving forward.

Each Collaborative Learning Team consists of two teacher chairs, along with other teacher leaders and members of the Administration who all share professional curiosity and interest in both student learning and their own learning as educators. Each collaborative team meets five times a year over the course of the school year.

Our Wellness inquiry involves conversations about the current wellness journey of our students, including how students are feeling and where they might require varied social-emotional support in the classroom. Our information-gathering will also provide our collaborative team with important information that will be used in developing strategies to share with all teachers in support of our students' social and emotional wellbeing.

Our Math inquiry involves an overview of our current math resources as well as a close look at the curriculum and its implementation alignment across branches. Our team is establishing a baseline collection of data regarding our students' knowledge and understanding of math concepts. This information will be invaluable to supporting mathematics alignment across grades and branches.

Our Literacy inquiry began by sharing perspectives on the strengths and needs of our students, teachers, and curriculum. We compiled the long-range plans of each grade to consider the scope and sequence of Literacy instruction, and critically reflected on areas that warranted further development. The Bet Hayered and Primary representatives formed a sub-group to focus on revising the Reading program in light of new research, while the

All our teacher-leaders feel that the Collaborative Professional Learning is highly beneficial to them as educators and to the school. One shared:

“It has been an amazing experience to collaborate with my colleagues in areas that we are passionate about. It has provided me the opportunity to develop and grow professionally while being a contributing member to the improvement of our school culture and practices.”

At AHS, we believe that this professional collaborative learning model supports the shift from our school being a place of teaching, to being a centre of learning and thinking. We are looking forward to our continued journey of learning.

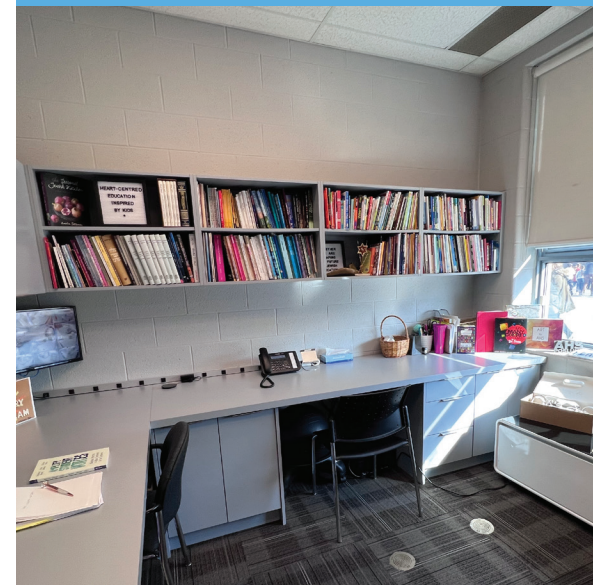

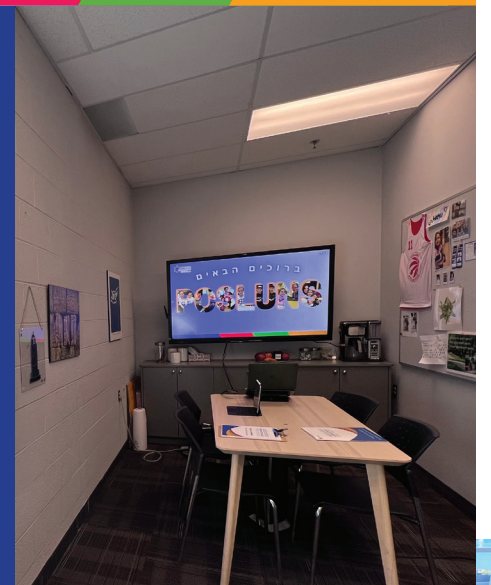

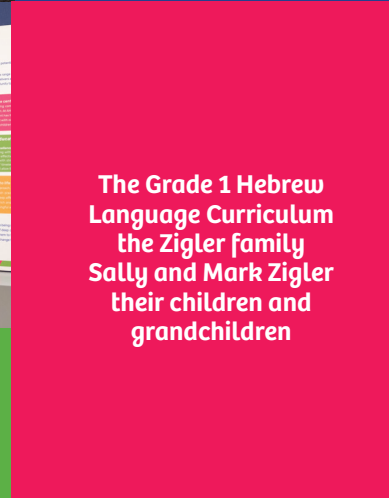

Remembering Gerda Frieberg ז"ל



We will miss our dear friend and beloved AHS great-grandparent, Gerda Steinitz Frieberg ז"ל.

Gerda, a Holocaust survivor herself, vowed to ensure the world learned of the horrors and remembered the victims of the Shoah, and she became a pioneer in Holocaust education. AHS was fortunate that, for many years, she made it a priority to come speak to our students at the Danilack Middle School on Yom Hashoah. Gerda was a rare survivor who could speak to our Grade 6 students in a way that young students could relate to: you could hear a pin drop in the room. Many of our students' parents would join us in order to hear her moving firsthand account. We are honoured to continue to share her book *I Kept My Promise* with our staff and with generations of our students.

Not only was Gerda dedicated to Holocaust education and a host of human rights causes, but she was also incredibly philanthropic. In 2005, she made a transformative gift to AHS, creating the Gerda Frieberg Education Fund, which, over the course of 10 years, provided tuition subsidies to over 450 AHS students in need. She, more than most, knew personally how important tuition subsidies are to sustaining our Jewish Day Schools.

Gerda is survived by her children, Josey Frieberg and AHS Grandparents Jack Frieberg and Sandra Herlick, her grandchildren, Adam and Sara, Mathew '02 and Lindsay, Seth '04 and Sarah, Orly '05 and Daniel, Jay, Dovid and Shoshana, and 11 great-grandchildren, one of whom is a current AHS student.

Remembering Rabbi Brumer ז"ל



AHS mourns the passing of our beloved Rabbi Pinchas Brumer ז"ל, a modest man with a gentle manner who was greatly respected by staff and students alike. The Toronto community remembers Rabbi Brumer as a teacher, a Rabbi, a Tzadik, and a brilliant Torah scholar. Associated remembers Rabbi Brumer, first and foremost, as the Judaic Studies Principal of the Junior High School. His dedication to education, which he expressed in his own special, quiet way, was evident to everyone who was fortunate enough to meet him. He was known for the patience and care he had for each of his students, no matter their backgrounds. He was an incredibly kind and loving Principal to all, and he was an inspiration to his co-workers as well as to his students.

The way he lived his life - in the classroom, in the admin offices, and in the synagogue - was clearly inspired by his deep love of Torah, and he, in turn, inspired so many others to love the Torah and live by its teachings.

Rabbi Brumer radiated calmness and comfort; he had a marvelous sense of humour and was a good listener. He will be fondly remembered for his character, his intellect, his love of teaching, and his trademark skills in leadership, perspective, and guidance: always thoughtful, always considerate, always caring. We extend our deepest condolences to his wife Martha and daughters Gittle '82 and Chava '87, and to his entire family.
